Dear Parents/Carers,

The children have been very excited this week to go out in the snow. On Wednesday they all put their wellies on and played outside until all the snow had been used up. They have enjoyed exploring how to make ice melt and looking at patterns they can make in the snow.

Reception children have continued to learn about space this week and have been finding out about the different planets. They have even made their own planets and written about which planet they would like to visit and why. I enjoyed working with Sienna and Ata in the Outdoor Learning Environment, where they drew all the planets in the solar system in the right order in chalk on the playground. Mia and Celia were also determined to get their all-weather gear over their school uniform and winter coats so that they could play in the mud kitchen.

We visited the library for a second time this week and some of the children were able to change their library books. Please can you make sure that children are reminded to bring their library books back on a Thursday. As part of our work around 'Alice in Wonderland' some children went in the Teaching Kitchen with Mrs Mepsted and had a wonderful time making jam tarts for the Queen of Hearts. Others made their own tea cup and saucer out of clay. We are hoping that they will be dry by next week so that we can paint them.

In Nursery this week, the children have also enjoyed playing out in the snow. I was also very impressed with their listening skills when they had to listen carefully to sounds played on the CD player and then decide what was making the sound. Well done Bluebell and Snowdrop Class!

Today, we had our first proper day with snow, so staff were in school and nursery early clearing the paths so that the children could come to school safely. The children have had lots of fun playing outside in the wetweather gear.

## **Emergency Closure**

If the school/nursery has to be closed during the school day the school will contact parents as soon as possible by email message or via telephone.

Members of staff make every effort to get to school/nursery, although in severe conditions they must make a judgement about the safety of travelling to school as some live quite a distance.

Please can I remind parents that the car park at the rear of the school is a staff car park. I would also ask that if you have any concerns about your child, you make an appointment through the school office because staff are not able to speak to you through the railings at lunch time as they are supervising the children.

Governing Body packs are now available for collection for anyone who is interested in becoming a Parent Governor. In order to be eligible, you must be a parent of a child who attends either the School or the Nursery. The deadline for nominations is 3.15pm on 6<sup>th</sup> February. If we have more than one nomination, then an election will be held.
