

<u>Our Week In Year One</u>

What have we been learning?

- This week we have been looking at length and height. We have been learning to measure and compare using non-standard units. We moved onto looking at units which were 1cm in length to bridge the gap between non-standard and standard units of measurement. The children have had a lot of fun measuring different items and their maths seed homework will reflect this learning this week.
- In RE we have been looking at Christian symbols and thinking about the way that different symbols make us feel and what they mean to some people.
- In science the children have been learning about materials and this week we introduced powders. The children could name lots of powders. We carried out an experiment where we added water to different powders and watched to see what happened.
- In topic this week we continued to make our moving pop-up books for Little Red Riding Hood. This week we learnt how to make a wheel mechanism!

Homework:

- Maths seed—Lesson 84. This unit focuses on measuring length. You could further this, offline, by looking at measuring the length and height of real objects using standard and non-standard units of measurement. The children did find it tricky to estimate and measure using body parts such as hands and feet. You could practise this at home.
- Spelling look, cover, write and check.
- Daily reading practise
- Phonics
