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Message from the headteacher:

What a start to the Spring term! Following the very last-minute announcement that our school should close when we return after the Christmas break and only be open to keyworker and vulnerable children, the staff have worked tirelessly to prepare for the support of learning both in school as well as for those children who are currently accessing our remote learning offer. Our biggest challenge has been to roll out remote learning which matches the units of work the children are accessing in school. Fortunately we were able to

arrange basic training in the use of TEAMS for all our teachers on the first day back and we have no doubt that as the days and weeks go by, you will see ongoing improvements in the delivery of lessons and the support of remote learning. Our Reception teachers have decided to move to TEAMS as well following a week where Tapestry was not able to support the sheer volume of remote access. Mrs Smart has been instrumental in liaising with Reach2 IT and supporting teachers with rolling out the use of TEAMS as a learning platform between ourselves and our families. Please see an update from her regarding remote learning, in particular live session etiquette and expectations below.

At present we have low numbers of pupils accessing in-school learning which has enabled us to create 3 year group bubbles and has allowed for a staff rota which supports pupils in class as well as for teachers to spend time out of class to plan and prepare tasks for children who are at home. This over and above conducting telephonic welfare and wellbeing checks on pupils and families at this time. We have staff who are self isolating and you can imagine that in a fairly new school where we only have 6 teachers and a handful of support staff this has placed additional strain on our capacity to deliver the level of excellence we believe our pupils and parents deserve. But we are determined to do our best and we'd like to thank you

for your patience and indeed the kind comments and letters of appreciation you have sent in to school this week.


