

This week we have been learning about different types of public transport. Public transport is a type of transport which you need to pay to get on, and you will be driven by a driver. We read an amazing story called 'The hundred decker bus' all about a bus which didn't have enough space for all the passengers, so they built new decks above the bus. We all designed our own buses and thought creatively about what our decks may look like. Some children had zoo animals, swimming pools, football pitches and disco's on their buses! We learnt about different types of public transport and looked at these in different cities. In New York they have subway trains which go under the city. In San Francisco they have trams which go along the roads. In Harlow there are buses, like the number 10 in Church Langley, and there is a train station so people can travel further. In London there are lots of different types of public transport like buses, taxis, trains, underground trains and even cable cars. These transport people around the city and often take commuters to work.

This week in math's we have been selecting and rotating shapes to fill a given space and using positional language to describe where shapes are in relation to each other. Reception have enjoyed creating their own tangram puzzles using various shapes to fit inside the square!
