This week we read a story about an Astronaut called Bob who works on the moon. Bobs job is very important; he cleans up the rubbish, gives tours to tourists and turns on the 'moonlight' at night. We wrote postcards to the man on the moon to ask him questions about his job. The children asked Bob things like 'Where do you sleep on the moon?' and 'How do you drink with a helmet on?'. We introduced question marks into our writing as a different type of punctuation.



We focussed on spacesuits this week and learnt all about what they are made from and how astronauts put them on. We watched some amazing videos about how astronauts practise working in space by wearing their spacesuits in swimming pools to get used to the feeling of less gravity.

We have continued learning about the number 5 and the children have been showing us their number bonds by making fact families to 5.
