Try some food from a different country in the UK and rate it out of 10.

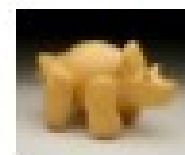


Draw a map of your bedroom. Make sure to label it and include the door and window.

Research a landmark from England. Write a diary entry imagining you have visited it.



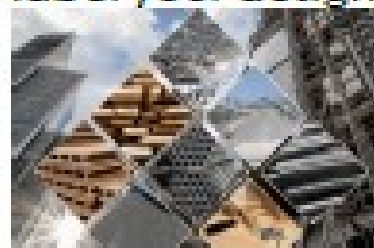
Can you discover an artist that uses clay? What are the names of some of their famous sculptures?
