
















Year 3

In Year 3, we have been busy enjoying our book 'The Witches' and writing some fantastic descriptions in preparation for our own story about witches, using a range of expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials. We have also enjoyed learning about the sculptor Alexander Calder and have begun making our own sculptures using wire, inspired by the king's crown. In addition, we have begun learning how to tell the time on clocks and will be learning how to tell the time to the nearest minute!































This half term in science, Year 2 have been learning about plants and how they grow. We have completed different experiments to find out which conditions allow optimum growth. We have also looked at the speed of plant growth and found where seeds come from. The children have enjoyed planting different seeds, taking responsibility to water their plants and have enjoyed watching























Snowdrop class have had an exciting end to their 'Down at the bottom of the garden topic'. We have been exploring the outdoor environment, learning about how trees grow and discussing what we can do to keep the environment happy! The children have enjoyed 'junk modelling' where they have focused on how we can repurpose materials and have even planted some sunflowers! We will be sending these home, and would love to see some photos on Tapestry, observing the growth of the children's sunflowers!





Reception have been learning about people who help us. We were so excited to have a visit from a firefighter! He told us all about his job and brought some equipment for the children to take a look at. We tried on fireproof jackets and protective helmets. It was awesome!





















Year 1

Year 1 have loved exploring different fruits this half term and how they would taste in a smoothie. We have planned, created and evaluated our own fruit kebabs and based on which fruits we enjoyed we used them to create our own tutti frutti smoothies. We even had some students going home and asking their parents to recreate them. It was so wonderful to see the passion the children had for healthy living.



This term has possibly been one of our favourites so far. The children are excited about going to reception and we have already started some small transitions such as calling the register at the beginning of carpet time. The children have been very creative while looking at the artwork of Andy Warhol and Van Gogh. They have created amazing representations of both artists' work. Our grass seeds shot up after 2 weeks and we have loved watching them grow longer and longer. We have even had to start giving some of them a trim. We planted some sunflower seeds and are waiting for them to grow. We now know the parts of the plant and we can draw and label a diagram orally or through writing. This week we have been reading 'Oliver's Vegetable' and have investigated some cooked and raw vegetables. One child said, "One was hard and one was soft......because one was raw and one was in boiling water."

In maths this term we have been learning a new number each week. This week we are on number 5 and we can show it in many ways: numicon, domino, dice, numeral, 5 frame and many more. Maybe you have heard your children singing a song at home?


















