What a wonderful couple of weeks in Reception! We are so proud of how well the children have settled into school and shown great resilience. They have been following the school routines and have used the visual timetable to know what is happening each day. It has been wonderful to see the children making lovely new friendships and showing great confidence in their new school environment. In Reception we have enjoyed reading a book called 'The Invisible String' and talked about how we are always connected to our families by an 'Invisible String' of love. Then all of the children enjoyed sharing photos of their families, discussing who is in their family and then carefully drew portraits of their families to put up on our display. Reception have also enjoyed visiting the library for the first time last week and the children showed us their amazing listening skills. We all remembered to use our whispering voices and enjoyed reading a variety of books together. Reception were very excited that they can pick one book each week to take home to read with their families at home. We are so proud of how well you have settled into school.







Blossom

Firstly we would like to welcome all new children into Blossom room for their first year at nursery. All the Blossom children have done incredibly well with settling back in amongst all the big changes they have faced. We have continued our summer topic by exploring the sand, water and painting with flower stamps to create our own summer picture. Over the next few weeks we will be transitioning into our autumn topic as the weather gets cooler.

















Year 4

Our new Year 4s have made a wonderful start to the new school year. We have already been very busy in Ash and Juniper class. Since our return to school we have already written beautiful poems, experimented with melting and freezing (including freeing Lego men from ice!), learned how mountains are formed and discussed what we would do with £1 million! We have been learning about William Morris, discussing wallpaper and learning about what life was like in factories in the 1800s. We created collages to show our appreciation for his work. During Juniper class's gymnastics lessons we have focussed on patches and points, demonstrating the different balances we could perform. Some amazing work on display!



Snowdrop

Snowdrop are off to a great start this September! We are seeing some lovely bonds forming between the teachers and children and they are busy exploring! Over the past weeks we have been focusing on the topic "All about me". The children have particularly enjoyed the story 'The colour monster' where we have been exploring expressing our emotions!



















This half term in English Year I have been learning about rhyming words. We then began to read the text 'After the Fall', by Dan Santat. We have used our senses to describe settings featured in the story.

In maths, we have been counting on and back and recognising numbers as words. We have been learning less than and more than a number. Our topic in art is Self Portraits. We have learnt who Picasso was. We created self-portraits and will explore thick, thin and curves lines.

What a great and busy start to Year 2! One of the things that we have been learning about is 'Kindness' in RE, which also links to one of our school values. The children looked at how they show kindness to others, and they wrote examples of a time when they were kind. The children then finished by writing and giving kind notes to each other which said things such as 'You make the world a better place', 'You always try your best' and 'You are a kind

The children in bluebell class have loved talking about their own families this term. We have been counting the amount of people that live in our house, drawing family portraits and creating our families faces using play dough. We have also restarted our weekly library visit which the children have absolutely loved. Next week we will be learning all about our 5 senses which we are very excited about as we have some exciting activities planned for the children! We look forward to taking part in the scarecrow competition and would love your help with bringing in some recyclable materials that we could use to build Bluebell's scarecrow.





Year 5

This half term, Year 5 have been learning about the artist David Hockney. As part of this they have experimented with digital art and recreated some of his landscape pictures'.















Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the year! We are enjoying reading our book 'The Bear and the Piano'. We have been acting in role as the bear, thinking about how he feels when he plays the piano. In English we have described the bear and the forest he lives in using a range of different adjectives to expand our noun phrases. We are also learning all about rocks in science and played a fun game of trying to guess which rock our partner had by asking different questions using our scientific enquiry skills. During our maths lessons, we have developed our confidence with looking at 3-digit numbers all the way up to 1,000 and representing these in different ways using flexible partitioning.


Attendance Matters!

Our attendance for each class for first few weeks of term is shown below. Well done to Willow Class with the highest attendance! Our school target for attendance is for each class to be above 96%.

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












We are so very proud of him as he received top marks with 90%. A distinction in his verse and prose solo exam of speech and language in drama. Well done Atiksh!








Important dates
