Year 5 have been continuing to get into the spirit this week with carol concerts, Christmas cards and Christmas tree decorations. Wishing you all a happy, healthy break.








#### Year 1

#### Year 2

Year 2 have had great fun in their learning this half term. They've enjoyed manipulating materials in science by squashing, stretching, twisting, and bending. They observed how materials can change when they made their own dough. The children have also been using base **10** in maths to represent addition and subtraction problems involving exchanging **10**, as well as lolly sticks to represent shapes. To finish off our term of raising money for good causes, Year **2** especially liked partaking in the Rudolph Run in order to raise money for St Clare's Hospice. Well done Year **2**!

Over the past few weeks Blossom have been getting in the festive mood. The children have been celebrating Diwali, Hanukkah and Christmas. The children have had lots of fun helping to bake some biscuits and make lots of Christmas surprises for their families. #### Bluebell

The children in Bluebell have really enjoyed the run up to Christmas! They have been writing letters to Father Christmas, decorating the Christmas tree in the role play area, and pretending to bake using Christmas scented playdough. They have also made cards and gifts for loved ones, enjoyed a delicious Christmas lunch and preformed a carol concert to their parents.













#### Snowdrop

Snowdrop have had a lovely end to the half term engaging in Christmas activities! The children have particularly enjoyed learning Christmas rhymes and creating some special decorations for their Christmas trees. We have also been working hard illustrating and writing our letters to Santa!











#### Year 4

Year 4 have had an amazing last few weeks busying ourselves with developing our knowledge of multiplication and division. They are now well versed in their understanding of factor and multiple alongside knowing the Distributive law and Commutative law of mathematics. It has been excellent to see their fluency improve in class and through their use of TTRS. Alongside this we have really enjoyed our class guided reading, based on the book Kasper Prince of Cats. The children have really delved deeply into understanding the complex vocabulary presented in the book while enjoying looking at the origin of words such as 'manhandle' and their relevance today. In addition to this, we have studied the mythology of Romulus and Remus to consolidate our Roman understanding and rewritten the myth to tell around a fireplace to pass the story on like the Romans might have done themselves. Our science has revolved around electricity and to understand how circuits work. We have experimented with insulators and conductors. During our DT we learnt how bread was made, enjoyed tasting a range of different breads and finally planned and made our own soda bread. The children had heaps of fun in this run up to Christmas!
