Year 4

It's been a very busy start to 2024 in Year 4. In science, we have been investigating sound. We wanted to find out whether sounds could travel through solids and liquids. We made string telephones and then had a wonderful time testing them out and then tried a hydrophone to see if we could hear sounds made underwater! In geography, we have been learning about Spain. We discussed trade between Spain and Britain and talked about the things that Britain imports and exports from Spain. We talked about the impact on the environment of importing so many fruit and vegetables from other countries and decided to see if we could grow our own tomato plants in our classrooms. During our English lessons, we debated whether or not zoos should continue to exist. The children presented evidence, challenged opinions and asked some very thought-provoking questions! The result? Year 4 voted that zoos should be illegal!



Year 2

Year 2 have had a busy and fun filled half term. We have been setting goals and creating dream birds in PSHE, learning all about the Jewish religious festival of Passover in RE and enjoyed food tasting for a Seder Meal. The children were especially overjoyed to create their own felt purses for our theme 'Wonderful World of Wool' in DT. The children had a go at making felt from scratch to adorn their purses.


