Year 4

In science, we've been exploring the fascinating topic of sound, conducting our own experiments to understand how it works. Additionally, we've been inspired by the iconic designer Vivienne Westwood to create our own upcycled T-shirts, learning about sustainability and fashion. We've also been engaging in lively debates about whether zoos should exist, encouraging critical thinking and respectful discussion. It's been an exciting and educational journey for evervone!

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Year 6 have had a brilliant half term and secured their silver award- a pyjama and movie day!

We rounded off our history topic 'Mayas' by having a hot chocolate 'Mayan style' complete with chilli. The children have worked so hard so far this year and it was lovely watching them all enjoy a treat.







Bluebell

Bluebell have had a roar-some half term investigating all things dinosaurs! The children have learnt new vocabulary including palaeontologist, herbivore, and carnivore and found it so exciting to learn that dinosaurs lived millions of years ago. They showed off their amazing prediction skills when we conducted a volcano experiment and have used their creative abilities to create fossils, as well as experimenting with bright colours to represent an erupting volcano! We look forward to next half term when we will go on a rhyming adventure in our Land of rhyme' topic.



Blossom

This term in Blossom the children have enjoyed exploring the cold weather through all types of play. In the garden we found some ice that formed over a cold weekend then brought some inside with penguins for them to explore how it melts and feels in their hands. We have also been learning about the animals who live in cold environments such as penguins, polar bears and whales. Blossom have also been using their physical skills to build snowmen and play with 'snowballs'.







Year 2

Year 2 have especially enjoyed our learning in Spring 1. One of the children's favourite things has been DT, which involved looking at where wool comes from, its uses, as well as how sustainable it is. The children practised the skill of creating their own merino wool by fusing the fibres together using bubble wrap and washing up liquid. They then used their hand made felt to adorn their final product purse. The children had a go at a running stitch to hold their felt purse together and their purses came out amazingly! Well done Year 2.



Year 3

In Year Three, we have had so much fun in science learning about different types of skeletons and how muscles make our bodies move. In history we have been learning about the Bronze Age and the Iron age and created our own bronze age inspired clay pots to kick start this topic. In English we have been working hard on our ambitious vocabulary choices and created haiku poems based upon out class story 'Alice in Wonderland'. Finally, in Maths we have worked extremely hard adding and subtract lengths by converting units of measure.




















Year 1

We have had a very creative half term in Year 1; in science we have been learning about properties of different materials. We have also had lots of fun in Art learning about Wasily Kansinsky and Mondrian; we painted our own abstract art!

In English, we have enjoyed reading our class text - Romeo at the Shard. We planned then wrote our own versions of the story.

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This half term, our Year 5 children have been learning about Ancient Greece. In our art lessons, we have been attempting to make Greek amphora. We learned about the different styles and uses of these amphora, how they might be decorated and what they tell us about life in Ancient Greece. Some were decorated with representations of everyday Greek life, some with stories of the Greek gods and some with depictions of miliary or sporting triumphs. We designed our own Greek amphora and then learned the pottery skills we would need to make them. The class loved working with the clay and are so proud of the pottery that they have made.

Snowdrop

This term in Snowdrop Class, we have been exploring our exciting topic, *Our Furry Friends*! The children have loved sharing photos of their own pets and looking at those of their friends, sparking lots of lovely conversations about how we care for animals.

We have enjoyed reading a range of animal-themed books, including *We're Going on a Bear Hunt, Dear Zoo,* and *What the Ladybird Heard.* These stories have inspired imaginative play, storytelling, and discussions about different animals and their habitats.

Some of our favourite activities have included:

- Making bear toast! The children used their practical skills to butter toast, cut fruit, and talk about hygiene when handling food. Best of all, they got to enjoy their delicious creations as a snack!

- Using potatoes to print ladybird pictures, exploring patterns, textures, and creativity.

- Matching up mummy and baby animals, which encouraged conversations about growth, family relationships, and animal names.

It has been a fantastic topic full of hands-on learning and fun! We look forward to our next exciting topic of Food, Glorious Food!




















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
