This half term, Year Three have become pop-up book experts! We have explored a variety of techniques that can be used to make an interesting pop-up book and created our own based on our class text 'Fortunately The Milk'. In science, we have had great fun learning about magnets and using the vocabulary of 'attract' and 'repel' to talk about if an object is magnetic. We have even made our own compass using a cork and a paperclip! Finally in RE we have be discussing the key topic 'Has Christmas lost it's true meaning?' which ended with a trip to St Mary's church where we found out why Christians celebrate Christmas.



















## Snowdrop

This half term in Snowdrop we have been exploring the magical world of nursery rhymes and festive fun with our topic, Twinkle Twinkle Here We Are. The children have been busy engaging in a variety of activities designed to spark their creativity, develop key skills, and celebrate the season in style.

One of our favourite activities has been making salt dough stars. The children carefully measured and mixed the ingredients, then explored the texture of the dough as they flattened and shaped it with star cutters. These stars have been baked. painted, and decorated, ready to take home and hang on your Christmas tree—a beautiful keepsake to treasure!

The children have loved singing along to the different nursery rhymes and completing many different nursery rhyme based craft activities. In our sensory tray, we've been investigating many nursery rhyme based sensory experiences. The children loved scooping and pouring, building their fine motor skills as they played.

As we stepped into December, the magic of Christmas has softly weaved its way into our classroom. The children have been role-playing with our snowy Christmas village and train set, practising patterns with Christmas-themed activities, and enjoying collaborative games like Feed Santa. These experiences are not only festive fun but also support vital learning, such as building friendships, developing fine motor skills, and building imagination.

### Year 1

This half term year 1 have been learning about writing letters linked to our text the polar express. Linking to this topic we went to Audley End to experience the Polar express for ourselves; the children had a great time doing a Christmas scavenger hunt and meeting Santa himself. In Science and D&T we have been learning about different materials. We have made a prototype for an umbrella and tested it; we had lots of fun. In maths we have learnt about addition and subtraction as well as fact families. In PSHE we have been learning to celebrate differences. The children have created a gingerbread man over the half term to show how we are different to one another as well as to think of strategies to stop bullying. In Geography we have been learning about the United Kingdom and looking at maps. We even ventured outside to create our own maps of the playground!





















This term in Blossom we have been exploring and learning about the Autumn season. The children enjoyed spending time laughing and splashing in the puddles after the rain. They have taken part in a range of sensory activities to promote their social and physical skills through sensory play of exploring different textures and materials. 






## Year 6








## Year 2
