Half-termly Curriculum Overview

Half Term	Autumn 1	Year Group	2
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English	Mathematics	Science
<u>Tin Forest</u> Centred around the story of 'Tin Forest' By Helen Ward, the children will be exploring the story and characters through writing a diary entry, setting description, recounting events and letter writing. They will look closely at different skills using expanded noun phrases, sentence types, questions and exclamations, suffixes, contracted words, similes, conjunctions and using emotive language.	<u>Place Value</u> In maths we are focusing on place value. Towards the end of Autumn 1 we move on to addition and subtraction. This will include - Identifying and representing numbers to 100 using concrete resources, place value charts and number lines. - Understanding the place value of a two-digit number- tens and ones. - Writing numbers to 100 in words. - Comparing and ordering numbers to 100. - Counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s.	<u>Weather and Climate</u> In science during Autumn 1 we are building on the children's knowledge of weather and include key knowledge on climate. This will include: - Looking at how human activity is changing the climate. - How climate change is impacting plants and animals. - How we can make a positive change for the environment.
History	Art & Design	Computing
<u>Frederick Gibberd</u> During Autumn 1 our focus is history, looking at Frederick Gibberd. We will look at Harlow before and how Frederick Gibberd has made changes to the town. We will compare Harlow in 1950 to today. We will look at significant features and use this to design our own towns. Finally, we will also understand life achievements of other local significant individuals. Linking to this topic, we will also be visiting the Gibberd Gardens.	<u>Portraits</u> Autumn 1 focuses on art and design, looking at portraits. We learn about the artist Rembrandt and explore techniques in shading as well as using different tints and tones with colour pencils. We experiment with proportion and detail of the 3D form of the face and draw our own portraits.	<u>Creating pictures</u> This half term we will be looking at different artistic styles and seeking to replicate them using digital art. Using styles pointillism and impressionism children will develop skills to save, import and resize images alongside making choosing as to how they will digital replicate these. Children will utilize the programme 2Paint A Picture available through their Purple Mash login.

Music	PE	PSHE
<u>Pulse, Rhythm and Pitch</u> The children will learn how music has a pulse, a steady beat. How music is also made up of long and short and high and low sounds, called 'rhythm' and 'pitch'. These elements combine when we sing and play. As the children listen to, sing, play and dance to the music in this unit, they explore these elements of music and how they work together.	In PE we will be focusing on: Dance: Children will continue to develop their ability to perform dances using simple movement patterns, responding to music and moving in time with it. They will work in pairs and small groups to create and perform short dance sequences, revisiting the understanding that a dance has a clear beginning, middle and end. Athletics: Children will recap and build on their running, jumping and throwing skills. They will work cooperatively in teams during events and begin to compete with increasing confidence, striving to improve their own performances as well as competing against others	<u>Being Me in My World</u> Identify some of my hopes and fears for this year.
